


ELECTIONS at Annual Membership Meeting Thursday, January 10th at 7:00 PM

Eddie Bracken Candidate for President



Eddie Bracken retired from the Air Force in 1992 after 33 years of service. For the first 25 years of his service he held various positions in fighter aircraft operations culminating as the Commander of a Tactical Fighter Wing in the United Kingdom, operating the F-111F. He had over 5,000 airmen under his command. The last 8 years of his service was focused in Logistics operations. He was the Vice Commander of an Air Logistics center that had over 25,000 civilian and military personnel assigned. He served a three-year tour in the Pentagon where he was the Director of Air Force Logistics Plans and Programs. In this capacity he was responsible for the formulation, advocacy

and execution of a \$50 Billion yearly budget for Air Force Logistics operations. His last assignment was at Wright Patterson AFB as the Chief of Staff for Air Force Logistics Command. In that time frame, Air Force Logistics Command had close to 90,000 military and civilian personnel assigned. Since his retirement from the Air Force he worked as a consultant to numerous aviation and space companies advising them on long range plans, financial strategies and business process re-engineering practices. He also worked on various studies for Air Force and Department of Defense. In the last eight years he has volunteered in a pro-bono status for numerous activities in the Pikes Peak region such as the El Paso County Planning Commission, the Colorado Springs Airport Advisory Commission, the Pikes Peak Combined Federal Campaign Board of Directors, the Chamber of Commerce's Eliminating Barriers to Business Working Group and the Black Forest Fire Department where he serves on the Board of Directors.

Judy Augustine Candidate for Vice President

Judy has most recently served the Black Forest Community Club as a Board member. This past year she helped organize the Log School Heritage Days' celebration. She also is a regular part of the team that works to put on the Black Forest Festival. Her volunteer service goes back to her days in Girl Scouts and includes being a docent at the Cheyenne Mountain Zoo, volunteering at Bent's Fort National Historic Site, and while there, travelling between La Junta and Albuquerque, NM, describing the Santa Fe Trail to Amtrak passengers with the National Park Service Rails and Trails program.



She can often be seen in the club's kitchen helping during events. Her previous offices in the BFCC have been vise president and secretary.

Jeff Spector Candidate for Treasurer



Jeff Spector is running for the office of Treasure of the Black Forest Community Club. Jeff has served as treasurer for the last 4 years. Jeff and his family have resided in the Black Forest for 7 years having escaped the rat race of the San Francisco Bay Area. Jeff and his wife, Debbie, have participated in the Black Forest Festival and other club event over the past six years. They enjoy being a member of the Black Forest community.

Barbara Barfield Candidate for Secretary

In 2002 Barbara Barfield founded Federal Employee Support for CFC Charitable Giving, Inc, a non-profit organization formed exclusively to administer the local Combined Federal Campaign (CFC), the federal government's employee philanthropy program that serves the military and federal agencies in the Pikes Peak region. Mrs. Barfield is responsible for the overall operations of the local Combined Federal Campaign that raises contributions for over 3000 human health and welfare charitable organizations. She provides leadership in carrying out the policies, procedures, and activities set forth by the Office of Personnel Management in Washington D.C., and local military and federal agencies.



Her responsibilities include administration, fundraising, communications, public relations, and central receipt and accounting. Since 2002, other campaign regions have sought her organization's campaign leadership. Currently, she administers the Pikes Peak CFC region, Metro Denver CFC and Three Rivers CFC in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Collectively, her organization raises over 7 million dollars annually. Prior to the CFC, Mrs. Barfiled was the Development Director and Youth Director for the American Heart Association in Southern Colorado.

Pete Burleson Candidate for 3 year Board Position



I grew up in a small farming community in western New York, graduated in electrical engineering from M.I.T. on an Alfred P. Sloan Foundation scholarship, and received an M.B.A. from Cornell University on a fellowship from Cornell Aeronautical Laboratory. I worked at the MITRE Corporation, a systems engineering company, for 32 years in Boston, Honolulu, Taipei, and Colorado Springs, as Technical Staff, Group Leader, Project Leader, and Site Leader. I have lived in the Black Forest since 1979, and except for 2 years in Taiwan, have been a member of the Community Club in most years since. I joined the Black Forest Fire/Rescue Board in 1982, and except for

about 8 years following relocation to Taiwan, have been on that Board until recently, serving as Board Chair for about 15 of those years. During my tenure as Board Chair, we built two new fire stations, established 24/7 crews of three paid personnel, and lowered the Insurance Services Organization rating from a 7 to a 5 (reducing homeowner's insurance costs). I also was primary author of the Black Forest Community Wildfire Protection Plan and drafted the City Charter for the Black Forest Incorporation effort.

The problems that arise for the Community Club Board are many and varied, and require perspective, persistence, fairness and adequate communication skills to achieve successful resolution. I believe my training and experience as a MITRE manager and on the Black Forest Fire Board have given me the requisite skills, and my love for the forest the needed dedication.

Bill Brugh fulfilling last year as a Board Member

Originally from Battle Creek, Michigan, Bill was raised and graduated from high school in Knox, Indiana. He then spent four years of service in the Air Force. After achieving his Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering, he spent many years traveling to satellite tracking stations around the world and this brought him to Colorado Springs in 1969. His family moved to Colorado in 1972 and they lived in Woodland Park before moving to the Black Forest in 1991. Bill retired as a Computer System Engineer from Ford Aerospace in 1995 but continued as an Engineering consultant with Lockheed Martin Corp until 2000.



Bill and his wife Norma had their 50th wedding anniversary this year. They have 4 sons, 10 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren. He spends time volunteering for the Black Forest Community Club, the Division of Wildlife, Slash/Mulch program, First Step Preschool and works as an election judge. He is also in a golf league and bowling league and enjoys hunting, fishing, camping and hiking with the grandkids. Bill likes going to the Baseball College World Series every year and often goes to the Indianapolis 500.

Larry Fariss has 2 more years as Board Member



Hailing from Medford, Oregon, Larry came to the Air Force Academy where he played football and did graduate work. After a varied military career during which he and Michelle and their 3 sons lived in Texas, Arkansas, Alabama, Pennsylvania, and Hawaii, his last few years of service were here at the AF Academy. He retired with the rank of Colonel after 29 years of service and 3400 flying hours. Still an avid athlete, Larry is now serving as president of the Black Forest Trails Association. Larry organized last year's BFCC trip to an AFA football game and is willing to do the same this year.
